This course is essential for people who are required to be able to provide first aid if an emergency situation arises in the course of their employment, or everyday life.

This course prepares learners to undertake the assessment to obtain a Statement of Attainment in HLTAID004 - Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting.

Mode of Delivery

Delivery of this course will be trainer led, face-to-face in a classroom setting combined with skills practice assessment

Assessment Summary

The student will be assessed by demonstrating procedures applicable to this unit. They will also be required to answer a number of oral and written questions regarding their actions and theoretical application of knowledge. The assessment will also be part of a simulated activity set by the assessor.

This assessment must be conducted by an assessor of Australian Professional Training Academy and must be completed in the workplace or in another environment that accurately simulates the workplace. The is to actively set tasks for the student and must observe these tasks being performed.



To standardise the application of this assessment, the assessment tasks (required skills and knowledge) are based on those specified in the Unit of Competency, HLTAID004 - Provide an



emergency first aid response in an education and care setting. The assessor will use an assessment instrument mapped accordingly to the assessment requirements of this Unit of Competency.

Assessors will apply an assessment procedure to ensure you are ready for the assessment and have the right resources and equipment to achieve the right standard.

- Recognise an emergency situation
- Apply appropriate first aid procedures
- Perform CPR in accordance with ARC guidelines
- Display respectful behaviour
- Operate AED
- Communicate details
- Evaluate the incident and your own performance

Course Conduct

Entry Requirements

- There are no prior competency requirements.
- Learners must be aged 18 years or older
- Photo Identification is required to confirm enrolment details.
- Language, literacy and numeracy skills required to undertake written and practical assessment activities.
- Learners must be physically capable of bending and kneeling to provide first aid to



a person on the floor. This includes performing CPR for up to 5 minutes.
